Key Elements:

- Text about community ties and long history in Dracut and nearby areas

- Description of firm's approach—personal attention, compassion, strong results

Strategy: Help visitors get to know and trust you as real people, not just a business.

Application: Make it easy for visitors to see your main services, contact your office, or request a consultation without searching.

Implementation: Add 'Schedule Consultation' and 'Details' buttons prominently on every service page and homepage.

Content Strategy

Area: Homepage and service pages

Recommendation: Rewrite the homepage and all main service pages to sound inviting, clear, and professional.

Implementation: Use clear language explaining each practice area and highlight the benefits of choosing your law firm.

Area: Local SEO content

Recommendation: Mention all target cities and towns in Massachusetts in the website content to show regional expertise.

Reason: Fast contact increases the chance of getting new leads and clients.

5. 5. Update content on homepage/service pages for clarity and professionalism
6. 6. Add local town mentions for SEO
7. 7. Final check for simple navigation and consistent stock imagery

Risk Mitigation

Plugin overload

Category: Website performance

Suggested Action: Use only essential plugins for banners, galleries, contact forms, testimonials, and SEO; avoid extra plugins that can slow down the site.

Stock images not matching local area

Category: Brand consistency

Suggested Action: Choose stock images that reflect Massachusetts culture and typical personal injury situations.
