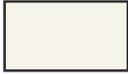

## Contact Page

**Description:** Add a contact page with the phone number, email, and address fields clearly shown, plus an easy-to-use contact form.

**Validation:** All contact details visible with a simple contact form that works and sends messages to the given email.

## Page Load Speed

**Description:** Make pages load faster by resizing large images where possible, since there are many high-resolution photos uploaded.

**Validation:** Images display quickly on both computers and phones; no extra wait time for galleries or banners.

## Service Pages

**Description:** Showcase main service pages: Yoga and Adventure Retreats, Virtual Yoga and Reflection, and One-on-One Yoga. Each should be clear, inviting, and have an easy way for visitors to take next steps.

**Validation:** Each service has its own page with a short summary, list of what's included, and button leading to the contact form.

## Special Offers Section

**Description:** Highlight the 10% early bird discount for retreats on the homepage where visitors can easily see it.

**Validation:** Special offer is visible above the fold (before scrolling) and includes simple instructions for how to redeem.

# Page Structure & Recommendations

## Homepage (*Landing*)

### Sections

# Implementation

## UX Psychology

**Principle:** Clarity and Warm Welcome

**Application:** Make sure every visitor understands what your business does within the first few seconds.

**Implementation:** Use a clear headline explaining adventures, wellness, and yoga experiences at the very top of your homepage, paired with inviting images.

**Principle:** Visual Storytelling

**Application:** People connect with real experiences and imagery.

**Implementation:** Show real guest photos in the gallery and banners so visitors can imagine themselves enjoying your retreat.

**Principle:** Ease of Use

**Application:** No one wants to hunt around for information, especially travelers on mobile devices.

**Implementation:** Put contact details and 'Book Now' options in obvious places on every page, and keep the menu simple.

## Content Strategy

**Area:** Service Pages

**Recommendation:** Break services into easy-to-read sections with a short summary, list of activities, and key benefits.

**Implementation:** For each service, use bullet points, bold headers, and simple words. End each with a clear action, like 'Contact us to reserve your spot.'

**Area:** Homepage

**Recommendation:** Highlight what sets you apart—your unique mix of adventure and healing.

**Implementation:** Use a statement near the top, such as 'Transform your mind and body with yoga, adventure, and nature in Bocas del Toro.'

**Area:** Special Offers

**Recommendation:** Put time-limited offers front and center to encourage booking.

**Implementation:** Include a colored box or banner with your 10% early bird discount and clear steps to claim it.

## Conversion Optimization

**Technique:** Simple Calls to Action

**Rationale:** People are more likely to reach out when instructions are clear and easy.

**Implementation:** Put 'Contact Us', 'Book Now', and 'Ask a Question' buttons in bright colors at the end of each page and near services.

**Technique:** Fast Mobile Experience

**Rationale:** Many travelers use phones. If the site is slow, they may leave.

**Implementation:** Resize images and test on phones so that pages and galleries load quickly and look good.

## Priority Focus

**Category:** Homepage Visuals and Messaging

**Description:** Start with the homepage, making the main banner clear and inviting, then highlight specials and key services.

**Reason:** The homepage is the first impression and should explain what you do, show your best images, and feature your special offer.

**Category:** Gallery Page

**Description:** Display your best photos so visitors know what to expect.

**Reason:** Exciting, real images convince people to book and help them imagine being there.

**Category:** Contact and Booking

**Description:** Add clear contact options and simple forms.

**Reason:** Making it easy to get in touch leads to more bookings.

## Implementation Order

1. Homepage structure with rotating banner, headline, and special offer
2. Main menu with links to Gallery, Services, About, Contact
3. Gallery page with all images
4. Create service pages (Yoga and Adventure Retreats, Virtual Yoga and Reflection, One-on-One Yoga)
5. Contact page with contact details and simple form
6. Test entire site on both computers and phones for speed and clarity

## Risk Mitigation

### Slow image-heavy pages

**Category:** Technical

**Suggested Action:** Resize all photos before uploading. Test galleries and banners to make sure they load quickly, especially on mobile devices.

### Unfamiliar visitors not understanding services

**Category:** Content

**Suggested Action:** Keep descriptions simple, add clear lists of what's included, and use headings that match what travelers are searching for.

#### **Missed messages from the contact form**

**Category:** Technical

**Suggested Action:** Test the contact form several times to confirm emails go to the right address. Include a phone number as backup.

#### **Business Impact**

**Impact Level:** High
