Imagery Style

Use warm and natural photos that show peaceful nature scenes, sunlight through trees, open hands, and comfortable home-like spaces. Include images that reflect Georgia's landscape and a diverse range of adults and couples. Avoid sterile office photos; instead, use images that feel personal and comforting.

Overall Aesthetic

Theme Style

Homepage (*Landing*)

Purpose: Welcome visitors, introduce Roots and Branches, and guide people to explore services or get in touch.

Sections

Hero

Purpose: Make a strong first impression by showing who you help and what you offer.

Key Elements:

- Photo of Dr. Virginia Felder or calming/therapeutic image
- Short message about psychotherapy and spiritual counseling
- Menu at the top for easy navigation
- Rotating banner with selected images to add warmth
- Your logo (even as a simple placeholder)

Strategy: Quickly help people see they're in the right place. Offer an easy path to learn more or reach out for services.

Psychology: Visitors often decide quickly if a practice feels safe and trustworthy. Calming images and a clear introduction create comfort.

Tone: Use warm, supportive language. Make people feel welcomed and understood, especially those struggling with change or seeking healing.

Cta Block

Psychology: Reassures people who may feel hesitant to seek help. A gentle nudge to act helps them overcome worries.

Tone: Encourage visitors in a gentle and inviting way. Avoid pushy phrases; focus on support and understanding.

About The Practice (*Information*)

Sections

Profile Intro

Cta About

Purpose: Invite the visitor to reach out or schedule.

Key Elements:

- Simple button to contact or schedule (<https://virginia-felder.clientsecure.me>)
- Reassuring phrase about privacy and the first step

Strategy: Prompt the next step right after someone feels confident.

Psychology: Timing the invitation when people feel trust increases action.

Tone: Supportive and motivating, but not urgent or forceful.

Despachos (Service)

- Brief reminders about privacy

Strategy: Make first outreach easy and non-threatening.

Psychology: Online forms/buttons are less intimidating than a cold call.

Tone: Gentle reassurance.
