Imagery Style

Use high-quality, professional stage photos when possible. When unavailable, choose images that show the feeling of the theater: spotlights, curtains, silhouettes, and behind-the-scenes moments. Use images sparingly to keep the site clean and simple, as requested.

Overall Aesthetic

Simple, professional, and easy to read. The site should feel welcoming to other professionals but also creative, hinting at Broadway and international experience without looking busy or flashy.

Theme Style

Classic theater with modern touches. Think dark backgrounds with pops of red for drama, crisp white text for clarity, and subtle lines or boxes to organize the information. Use a placeholder logo for now.

Layout Approach

Keep it straightforward. Use lots of space around sections, clear menus, and big headings so visitors can find what they need fast. Each page should focus on one topic at a time, with the main services front and

center and any long lists easy to scan. Include room for a button or link styled to look like a stage script or curtain, connecting to the Sailing History page as requested.

Homepage

Validation: Homepage headline and intro show what the business offers and highlight experience; top three services each have a short summary and a contact method.

Navigation

Description: Set up the site menu to include Home, Watson CV, Production History, Sailing History, and Contact Us, making it simple to find and use.

Validation: Menu has all 5 required sections and is easy to spot on every page.

Contact

Description: Display your email address and phone number on every page so people can easily reach you.

Validation: Email and phone are visible on all pages, not just the contact page.

Call to Action

Description: Add a contact form in the Contact Us page for direct inquiries, keeping it basic (name, email, message).

Validation: Contact form works and sends messages to the right email.

Content Pages

Description: Use your own uploaded documents for the Watson CV, Production History, and Sailing History pages, with content left as provided. Add a linked quote box that leads to Sailing History from the Production History page.

Validation: Pages show your exact text. Linked quote takes visitors directly to Sailing History.

Visual Branding

Description: Use a simple placeholder logo since none is provided. Use only a few stock images that match the theater theme and include any customer-supplied images if provided later.

Validation: Placeholder logo visible, images are relevant and enhance professionalism.

Mobile Access

Description: Make sure all pages and navigation are easy to read and use on phones and tablets.

Validation: Pages show up clearly and work well on phone and tablet screens.

Page Speed

Description: Make pages load faster by limiting large files and images, since no complex features or galleries are needed.

Validation: Site loads fully in under 3 seconds on typical home internet and mobile connections.

Accessibility

Tone: Clear, factual, and focused on professional achievements.

Production List Link

Purpose: Lead visitors to the full Production History page.

Key Elements:

- Short sentence or button directing to Production History

Strategy: Guide the audience to explore more about your work history.

Psychology: Simple pathways keep visitors engaged on the site.

Tone: Friendly and straightforward—encourage further exploration.

Production History (*Portfolio*)

Purpose: Display a complete, updated list of productions and special projects, with the most recent and important work highlighted.

Sections

Production List

Purpose: Provide a detailed list of all past theatre productions.

Key Elements:

- Easy-to-read, updated text list (not in a table)
- Highlight of major or notable productions
- Download link or viewable attachment for the official production history document

Strategy: Visitors can quickly see depth and variety of experience—builds trust and shows credibility.

Psychology: A well-organized, up-to-date record reassures collaborators of your professionalism.

Tone: Neat and uncluttered. Let your work speak for itself.

Current Projects

Purpose: Feature any current or ongoing projects that can be updated easily.

Key Elements:

- Text section titled 'Current Projects'
- Option for easy updates
- Visual cue (such as an open stage curtain) to separate this section

Strategy: Shows the business is active and busy with new work.

Psychology: Current activity signals momentum and drives more interest.

Sections

Sailing Overview

Purpose: Introduce the reason behind including a sailing page.

- Intro text taken from the uploaded Sailing Post Script
- Personal insights or stories tied back to the business or owner where relevant

Strategy: Present your story in a way that humanizes the business and creates a memorable impression.

Psychology: Personal touches make your site more relatable and memorable, even for theatre professionals.

Tone: Warm, engaging, and personal—share the story as if talking to a peer or friend.

Sailing Resume

Purpose: Offer a detailed, downloadable summary or a viewable file of sailing achievements.

Key Elements:

- List of key sailing milestones
- Download link or embedded resume for those interested

Strategy: Add a unique angle to your business, which may deepen connections.

Psychology: People like to see the person behind the professional.

Tone: Clear and proud—show off what makes you unique without being boastful.

Contact Us (*Contact*)

Purpose: Provide a simple way for visitors to get in touch, with clear instructions and all the info they need.

Sections

Contact Details

Purpose: List all the ways visitors can reach out to you.

Key Elements:

- Phone number and email
- Physical address
- Quick contact form for easy questions

Strategy: Give multiple ways to connect, lowering barriers and making it convenient.

Psychology: The easier it is to reach out, the more likely people are to do so.

Tone: Friendly and responsive—let them know you're available and look forward to talking.

- Mission & Values

Implementation

UX Psychology

Principle: Clarity builds trust

Application: From the first glance, show visitors they are in the right place by explaining clearly what you do and who you help.

Implementation: Write a simple opening statement on the homepage, such as 'Broadway and International Theatrical Production Experts for NYC and Connecticut.'

Principle: Easy navigation reduces frustration

Application: Keep the menu short and make sure every section is easy to find so visitors can quickly get where they want to go.

Implementation: Create a top menu with Home, Watson CV, Production History, Sailing History, and Contact Us.

Principle: Consistency increases professionalism

Application: Use the same style, fonts, and color scheme throughout the site to show you are organized.

Implementation: Set one or two fonts and colors for headings and body text and stick with them everywhere.

Content Strategy

Area: Service Descriptions

Recommendation: Describe your top three services (Producing, Directing, Consulting) in a few sentences each using strong, confident language.

Implementation: Use plain language to explain how each service benefits potential collaborators, keeping details focused on results and expertise.

Area: Professional Credentials

Recommendation: Use your own CV and production history as proof of your work and experience.

Implementation: Copy your provided text to the Watson CV and Production History pages, making sure it is readable and formatted simply for the web.

Area: User-Requested Features

Recommendation: Include special links and quote boxes that let users click to see related content, like the 'Sailing History' page.

Implementation: Turn the quote box on the Production History page into a clickable button that leads directly to the Sailing History page as requested.

Conversion Optimization

Technique: Simple contact form

Rationale: Visitors who can message you directly are more likely to reach out than those who have to copy your email address or call.

Implementation: Use a straightforward contact form with fields for name, email, and message, placing it on the Contact Us page.

Technique: Visible contact details

Rationale: Many visitors want to call or email quickly; showing contact info everywhere makes this easy.

Implementation: Repeat your phone and email in the footer and at the top or bottom of each main page.

Priority Focus

Category: Navigation and Content Clarity

Description: Make sure site visitors can find all major sections and understand what each page is about right away.

Reason: This helps busy theatre professionals and performers move through your website quickly and with confidence.

Category: Fast and Mobile Access

Description: Ensure the site works well and loads fast on all devices, especially phones and tablets.

Reason: Much of your target audience will check your site from mobile devices, so it must look good and perform well everywhere.

Implementation Order

1. Set up main navigation menu
2. Build homepage with summary and top services
3. Add Watson CV, Production History, and Sailing History using uploaded text files
4. Add quote box link to Sailing History
5. Create Contact Us page with contact form and display phone/email on all pages
6. Add simple placeholder logo and relevant images
7. Test site on mobile devices
8. Check that all pages load quickly
9. Review all links and contact functions

Risk Mitigation

Outdated or broken links

Category: Content management

Suggested Action: Regularly check that all links, especially the special 'Sailing History' link, still work as intended.

Plugin contact form failure

Category: Form function

Suggested Action: Test the contact form after setup and again after each update to confirm messages are being sent and received.

Business Impact

Impact Level: High
