Imagery Style

Use only real, high-quality photos from the marina and harbor. Show boats in slips, the dock, and the historic village. Avoid stock photos. Images should feel welcoming and authentic to show the real Navy Point experience.

Overall Aesthetic

Clean, inviting, and classic. No clutter or dark backgrounds. Use plenty of space around items so everything feels open and safe. The design should highlight the marina's real photos and create trust right away.

Theme Style

Requirements & Features

Website Design

Contact and Reservation Forms

Description: Feature a simple reservation form for slip rentals, with clear options for transient or annual requests, and collect only important details (like boat type and dates).

Validation: Form is present on Reservations page, works on desktop and mobile, and fields go to the correct email address.

Members-Only Area

Description: Set up a secure members-only page for marina clients to see schedules and fill out launch forms. Limit these pages to logged-in users only.

Validation: Members page requires login and displays correct information and forms; not visible to the public.

Photo and Video Content

Description: Use real marina and boating photos supplied by the business. Place feature videos about the marina and services on relevant pages. No stock images.

Validation: All visuals come from business uploads; videos load on Service and Home pages.

Mobile and Desktop Usability

Description: Make sure the entire website works and looks good on both smartphones and computers, especially forms and videos.

Validation: Forms, menus, and videos work on mobile devices; pages are easy to read and use.

Seasonal and Rate Information

Description: Make the marina's seasonal schedule and rates easy to find. Attach updated rate PDFs and link the latest launch schedules.

Validation: 2025 Rates PDF downloads correctly; launch schedules appear on the Members page.

Page Structure & Recommendations

Homepage (*Landing*)

Purpose: Welcome new visitors and give a quick, clear idea of what Navy Point Marine is all about. Help people see why this marina is safe, friendly, and unique, and guide them easily to the services they need.

Sections

Hero

Purpose: Make a great first impression by showing beautiful images of the marina and highlighting what makes Navy Point Marine special: a safe harbor, a historic location, and superior service.

Key Elements:

- Large welcoming photo of the marina in Sackets Harbor
- Headline describing Navy Point as a safe, full-service deepwater marina
- Short sentence about the history and protected harbor
- Easy-to-find button to view slip rates or request a reservation

Strategy: Showcase safety, convenience, and unique historic charm right away to build trust and encourage visitors to make a reservation or learn more.

Psychology: People want to feel confident their boat and family are safe and will appreciate local roots and a warm, friendly environment. Clear options and friendly images help them feel at ease.

Tone: Use friendly, welcoming, direct language. Highlight the sense of community, safety, and relaxation.

Cta Block

Purpose: Clearly invite visitors to take action, such as reserving a slip, learning about services, or contacting the marina.

Key Elements:

- Simple button to contact you
- Button to request a reservation
- Short statement on why to choose Navy Point
- Contact details like phone and email

Strategy: Remove uncertainty about next steps. Make it easy to reach out or start a reservation.

Strategy: Build trust with proof: certifications and customer-focus.

Cta Block

Purpose: Encourage visitors to contact for repairs, upgrades, or questions.

Key Elements:

Strategy: Make it as easy as possible to get started.

Psychology: Visitors want simple steps to connect with experts.

Tone: Clear, helpful, welcoming.

Live (*Inner*)

Purpose: Give visitors real-time updates and videos about the marina, the village, weather, and events in Sackets Harbor.

Sections

Video Showcase

Purpose: Show life at Navy Point and Sackets Harbor through video.

Key Elements:

- Video clips about marina life
- Friendly captions about what people see

Strategy: Help visitors picture themselves at Navy Point with their family and boat.

Psychology: People imagine their own experiences when they see others enjoying a place.

Tone: Upbeat and welcoming; keep captions warm and simple.

Weather Block

Purpose: Give boaters useful local weather and forecast info.

Key Elements:

- Weather map or forecast, simple to read
- Tip explaining how to use the chart

Strategy: Show practical value and make the site a helpful resource.

Psychology: People feel cared for when you make planning easy.

Tone: Helpful and clear, avoid jargon.

Reservations (*Conversion*)

Purpose: Let visitors request a boat slip quickly and find out details about pricing for the season or for short visits.

Sections

Reservation Info

Purpose: Explain the types of slip reservations (annual, summer only, or one-time) along with what's included.

Key Elements:

- Easy chart or section with rates, link to 2025 PDF
- Short list of what's included (WiFi, power, water, storage, etc.)

Strategy: Answer key questions up front to remove guesswork and encourage booking.

Psychology: Families and boaters want information fast so they can make decisions quickly.

Tone: Direct, friendly, focused on benefits.

Reservation Form

Purpose: Collect key details for slip reservation requests using a simple form.

Key Elements:

- Form for name, boat info, preferred dates, and contact details
- Clear fields for annual and transient slip options
- Notes about what happens after submitting

Strategy: Gather all needed info up front so there's no back-and-forth or confusion.

Psychology: A clear form makes people feel the process is smooth and care-free.

Tone: Supportive and positive, using everyday language.

Simple Contact Form

Purpose: Allow visitors to send a message right from the website.

Members (*Private*)

Purpose: Provide a private, secure page where boat owners can view haul schedules, check the status of their boats, and fill out important launch forms. Only members can access this area.

Sections

Member Dashboard

Purpose: Give members a personalized overview of their boats' haul status for the season in a way that's easy to understand.

Key Elements:

- Easy-to-read boat haul and launch schedule by week
- Icons showing which steps are complete (form received, ready for haul, boat hauled)
- Legend explaining the icons

Strategy: Offer an organized, exclusive experience that strengthens trust and satisfaction with the marina.

Psychology: Exclusivity and having everything in one place makes members feel valued and respected.

Tone: Clear, organized, straightforward, and respectful – treat members as VIPs.

Launch Form

Purpose: Let members fill out their seasonal launch/commissioning form right on the website, without needing to download or print.

Key Elements:

- Online custom form for launch info
- Option to download form as PDF if desired
- Instructions on submitting and next steps

Strategy: Streamline paperwork to save members time and hassle.

Psychology: Making processes easier shows you care about your members' experience.

Tone: Helpful, encouraging, and step-by-step simple.

Implementation

UX Psychology

Principle: Clarity and Simplicity

Application: Make information about dockage, storage, and services easy to find and understand on the home page and main menu. Use large, readable text and avoid clutter.

Implementation: Have a clear menu at the top; group services in simple sections; use plain language and short sentences for each offering.

Principle: Trust and Reassurance

Application: Highlight Navy Point's safe harbor, history, and customer service. Use real photos to create a relatable and trustworthy feeling.

Implementation: Feature marina's protective location and experience; show real people and boats; include a short welcome from the owner.

Principle: Reduce Steps to Action

Application: Allow families and boaters to request reservations or log in for forms with as few clicks as possible.

Implementation: Put reservation and login buttons in top menu and on every relevant page, and keep forms as short as possible.

Content Strategy

Area: Service Pages

Recommendation: Write short, clear descriptions for each service, focused on what families and boat owners care about (safety, convenience, amenities).

Implementation: On each service page, start with a one-sentence summary, followed by bullet points on benefits (like Wi-Fi, electric, winter storage).

Area: Seasonal/Time-Sensitive Content

Recommendation: Update pages with yearly rates and schedules, and make sure past years' info is removed promptly.

Implementation: At the start of each season, upload the newest schedule and rate PDFs; check and update all text about dates or deadlines.

Area: Member Area

Recommendation: Make the members-only section feel exclusive with quick access to launch forms, icon status, and schedule reminders.

Implementation: Make sure login works smoothly. Use clear labels and icon explanations for forms, and include a welcome message just for members.

Conversion Optimization

Technique: Prominent Forms and Clear Calls to Action

Rationale: People are more likely to fill out a contact or reservation form if they are easy to find and use.

Implementation: Place the reservation request form near the top of the Reservations page, with a clear headline. Use a bold button labeled 'Request a Slip Today.'

Technique: Show Real Experiences

Rationale: Potential customers trust real images over stock photos, and videos increase engagement.

Implementation: Add customer photos on each page and embed service videos directly where they are mentioned.

Technique: Fast, Friendly Follow-Up Messaging

Rationale: Visitors feel valued if they know what happens next after they submit a form.

Implementation: Display a friendly thank-you message after every form submission, explaining when they'll hear back.

Priority Focus

Category: Reservations and Member Access

Description: Make it quick and easy for visitors to request slips or get to their Member area for schedules and launch forms.

Reason: Quick access leads to higher satisfaction and fewer phone calls; families and boaters expect an easy process.

Category: Clear, Updated Information

Description: Keep all dates, rates, and forms current so boaters have the information they need for planning.

Reason: Outdated info causes confusion and extra work; up-to-date content builds trust.

Category: Showcase the Marina's Unique Qualities

Description: Display real photos and videos that highlight the location's history and natural protection.

Reason: Families and boaters are drawn to places that feel safe and special; this sets Navy Point apart.

Implementation Order

1. Set up main design and structure using client photos and clear colors
2. Create service and reservation pages with main forms
3. Add member-only section and launch forms, test login access
4. Upload and link correct rate schedules and PDFs
5. Place videos and icons in correct spots
6. Test all pages on phones and computers
7. Review and launch after final owner approval

Risk Mitigation

Outdated Rates or Schedule

Category: Content

Suggested Action: Plan to update rate PDFs and launch schedules each season; review content every spring and fall.

Member-Only Pages Visible to Public

Category: Security

Suggested Action: Test that member pages require login and cannot be found by public users or search engines.

Difficult Form Completion

Category: User Experience

Suggested Action: Keep forms short, only ask for required information, and test with actual members and customers before launch.

Business Impact

Impact Level: High
